**Title: Weekly update**

In order to keep our site in a tip, top condition for our customers, contractors, and visitors it is necessary to maintain and manage our internal access roads.

Roads are built up using imported stone and hardcore, to provide a strong surface to allow vehicles to reach the furthest parts of our site.

During rainy and wet weather, we maintain the roads by scraping off mud and detritus, adding additional layers of hardcore where needed.

When we are lucky enough to have periods of warm and dry weather, it is necessary to add water to our roads to dampen down dust and prevent it becoming airborne. This is achieved by the use of a tractor and bowser to spread a thin layer of water across our access roads, in common with the waste industry.

Recently Walleys Quarry has invested in a system of perforated pipework, which will apply water along some of the main site access roads where dust can be generated. The system applies water over long stretches of site access roads, allowing good control of dust in key, critical areas.
